INSIGNIA OF THE ORDER

The badge of the insignia of the Order has an eight pointed white enamelled cross. Between each arm of the cross is a gold two headed eagle and the Arms of the Order, which is a white cross on a red oval shield.

The cross is surmounted with a gold crown and attached by a link ring to a gold trophy bearing the Arms of the Order. The insignia is suspended from a neck ribbon.



MANTLE OF THE ORDER

The mantle of the Order is a full length red robe, vertically edged with white satin and with a white satin collar. The whole mantle is lined with white satin.

An eight pointed cross also in white satin is on the left side of the mantle.



GRAND PRIORY OF AUSTRALASIA ITEMS

LAPEL BADGE

The lapel badge of the Order is an 8mm enamelled red badge with the eight pointed white Maltese Cross, all edged in gold.



TIE (Official)

The official tie of the Order is navy blue having a pattern of a white cross on a red shield and the eight pointed white Maltese Cross.



SCARF

The scarf of the Order is a rectangular navy blue scarf having a pattern of a white cross on a red shield and the eight pointed white Maltese Cross.



BOW TIE

The bow tie of the Order is navy blue having a pattern of a white cross on a red shield and the eight pointed white Maltese Cross.



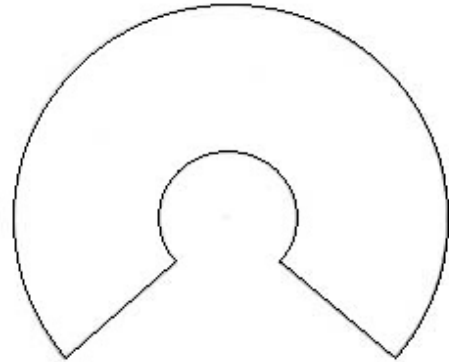
RANK OF THE ORDER BY NECK RIBBON AND MANTLE COLLAR

Knight/Dame of Honour KSJ/DSJ

Neck ribbon bearing the insignia of the Order.
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ)
and not the OSJ Official or plain tie. The neck
ribbon is placed under the shirt collar.



Knight/Dame of Honour
Mantle collar with no braid.

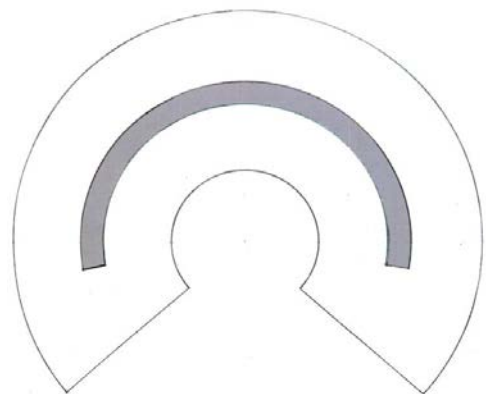


Knight/Dame of Grace KGSJ/DGSJ

Neck ribbon with one silver stripe and bearing
the insignia of the Order.
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ)
and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt
collar.



Knight/Dame of Grace
Mantle collar with one silver braid 38mm down
from the neck and finishing 76mm from the front
edge of the collar
(Diagram not to scale: refer to p8).



Knight/Dame Commander of Grace CGSJ

Neck ribbon with two silver stripes and bearing the insignia of the Order.

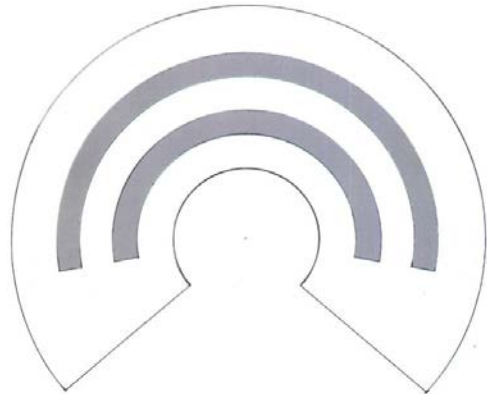
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ) and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt collar.



Knight/Dame Commander of Grace

Mantle collar with two silver braid finishing 76mm from the front edge of the collar. The second braid is 76mm down from the first braid.

Knight/Dame of Justice KJSJ/DJSJ

Neck ribbon with one gold stripe and bearing the insignia of the Order.

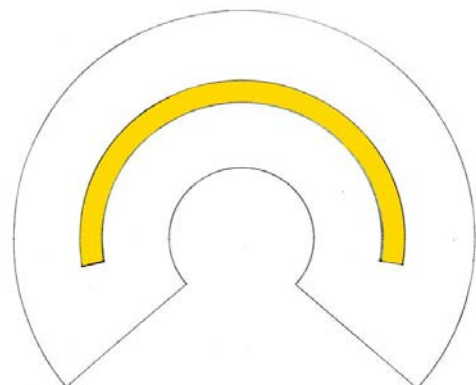
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ) and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt collar.



Knight/Dame of Justice

Mantle collar with one gold braid 38mm down from the neck and finishing 76mm from the front edge of the collar.

Knight/Dame Commander of Justice CJSJ

Neck ribbon with two gold stripes and bearing the insignia of the Order.

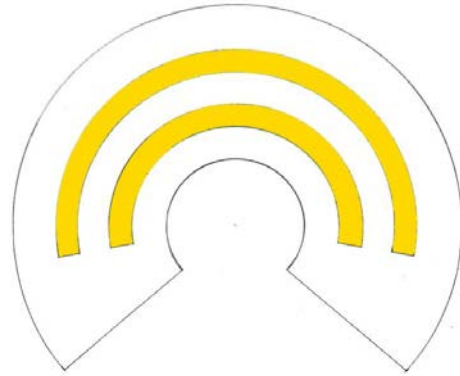
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ) and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt collar.



Knight/Dame Commander of Justice

Mantle collar with two gold braid finishing 76mm from the front edge of the collar. The second braid is 76mm down from the first braid.

Knight/Dame Grand Cross of Justice GCSJ

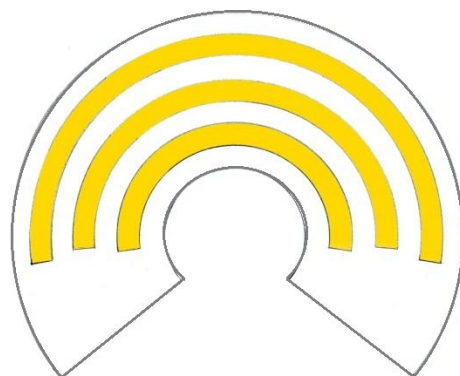
Neck ribbon with three gold stripes and bearing the insignia of the Order.

For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ) and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt collar.



Knight/Dame Grand Cross of Justice
Mantle collar with three gold braid finishing 76mm from the front edge of the collar. The third braid is equidistant between the first and second.

**Bailiff/Grand Dame Grand Cross of Justice
OSJ**

Neck ribbon with three gold stripes and bearing the insignia of the Order.
For Knights: worn with a bow tie (black or OSJ) and the neck ribbon placed under the shirt collar.



Bailiff/Grand Dame Grand Cross of Justice
Mantle collar with three gold braid. At each end, three small red Maltese Crosses surmounted by a Gold Russian Crown Star. (Diagram not to scale: refer to p8).



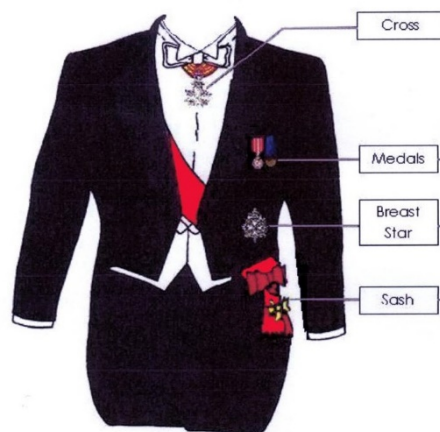
Breast Star of the Order

Worn on the left side of the coat by Knight/Dame Commander of Justice, Knight/Dame Grand Cross of Justice and Bailiff/Grand Dame Grand Cross of Justice. The Star is worn with formal wear but not with a lounge suit



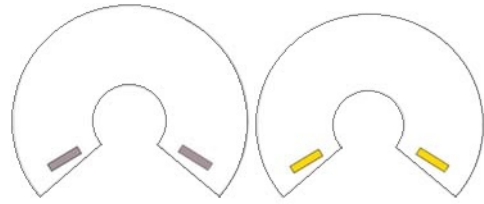
Sash of the Order

Knight/Grand Dame Grand Cross of Justice and Bailiff/Grand Dame Grand Cross of Justice wear the sash of the Order (with the badge of the Order on the lower edge) over the right shoulder to the left hip and under the jacket. The sash is worn only with formal wear and not with a lounge suit.

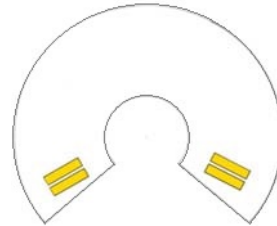


LEADERS OF THE ORDER

Commander of Commandery Braid of rank and one silver bar (50 mm long) at each front edge of the collar if K/D of Grace or one gold bar at each front edge of the collar if K/D of Justice.



Prior of Priory Braid of rank and two gold bars each 50 mm long at each front edge of the collar.



Grand Prior of Grand Priory Braid of rank and three gold bars each 50 mm long at each front edge of the collar.

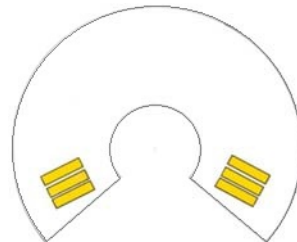


Diagram summarising rank placement. Braid width: 15 to 22mm.
